For 70 years the Austin Branch has been actively involved with Mainspring—an early childhood, family-centered community where children enjoy learning and become self-assured and socially competent in order to excel in school and in life. Children from 6 weeks to 5 years old are grouped in five classrooms based on age and individual development. From South Lamar Blvd. & Oltorf St.: Go east on West Oltorf St. to the first light at South 5th St. Turn left. Take the first left, Brodie St., a one-block long street that deadends at the school. Turn left and drive around to the front entrance of the building and park.

From Mopac: Take the Cesar Chavez exit and head east toward downtown. Turn left at the first stop light; it will circle around and bring you up to the Lamar Bridge. Turn right onto Lamar Blvd. Proceed south, crossing Barton Springs Rd. Turn left at the light at West Mary St. Turn right on South 6th St. [don't confuse that with 6th St. downtown—this is South 6th St.]. South 6th St. dead-ends at the school. Drive around to the front entrance of the building and park.

<u>From IH 35 & Oltorf</u>: Go west on Oltorf. You will cross Congress Ave. and South 1st St. Turn right at the light on South 5th St. Take the first left onto Brodie St., a one-block long street that dead-ends at the school. Turn left and drive around to the front of the building and park.


