LAF UPDATES FROM HOLLY KEARL, The Legal Advocacy Fund program manager

You should know that AAUW stands alone in the financial support of gender-based workplace cases, and we are highly regarded in the civil rights community for our work.

 $\sqrt{}$ Eight current LAF cases are in progress.

 \sqrt{AAUW} 's newest research report *Crossing the Line: Sexual Harassment in Schools* (grades 7-12) will be released in November 2011. This is the first report since AAUW's report *Hostile Hallways: Bullying, Teasing, and Sexual Harassment in Schools* 10 years ago to include nationally representative data on sexual harassment in schools, and it is unique for also including data on cyber sexual harassment.

 $\sqrt{}$ Eight exciting LAF Campus Outreach programs were funded last year. These took place in Alabama, California, New York, and Oregon on workplace discrimination, dating violence, stalking, sexual assault, fair pay, and Title IX and athletics.

 $\sqrt{}$ A sexual harassment in the workplace summit was co-sponsored by AAUW in October at Hunter College in New York City. Anita Hill delivered the keynote speech at the summit and signed copies of her new book *Anita Hill 20 Years Later: Sex, Power, and Speaking Truth*. Three panels of speakers throughout the day discussed what happened 20 years ago, shared what Anita Hill meant to them, and brainstormed the question "What comes next?" Gloria Steinem, Catharine A. MacKinnon, Maureen Dowd, Melissa Harris-Perry (an AAUW Fellowships & Grants recipient) were some of the outstanding panelists. AAUW also co-hosted a lunchtime discussion about sexual harassment in schools and on the streets. If you missed the conference, you can view it on C-Span's website.
