MAY PROGRAM HONORS FELLOWSHIP RECIPIENTS

Dr. Sylvia Garcia, The University of Texas at Austin Fellowship Selection Committee Chair, will introduce the four recipients of the AAUW Austin Branch Fellowships for the 2012-2013 academic year. Each will receive \$2,500 to assist them in their doctoral studies. They are <u>Andrea Gustavson</u> in the field of American Studies; <u>Marisa Miller</u> in Cell and Molecular Biology; <u>Shahana Khurshid</u> in Civil, Architectural and Environmental Engineering; and <u>Beibie Zou</u> at the LBJ School of Public Affairs. **Dorothy Vance** and **Larie Amsler** assisted Dr. Garcia in the difficult selection of the recipients from a field of outstanding candidates.

Andrea Gustavson's dissertation, "What Comes Home: Vernacular Photography and the Cold War, 1945 - 1991," considers photos taken by military men and women and explores how they construct their own visual archives of war. She will view digital, institutional, and literary archives as well as non-profit institutions and photographic albums.

The goal of Shahana Kurshid's dissertation is to study the potential health effects of an emerging airborne contaminant, reactive oxygen species (ROS) in various indoor and outdoor environments. Her dissertation is titled "Particulate Reactive Oxygen Species in Indoor Environments—Prevalence and Health Effects."

Marisa Miller's research interest is to improve the productivity of crops, many of which are hybrids and polyploids. Hybrids show increased growth vigor when compared to their parents, but the molecular mechanism for the increased vigor is relatively unknown. "Regulation of Circadian Rhythms and Growth Vigor in Arabidopsis Hybrids and Polyploids" is the title of her dissertation.

Beibie Zou's work focuses on insurance regulation; her research examines title insurance across five states. Title insurance is the charge added to the cost of buying a home to insure the title of the property is clear and good. Her dissertation is "Regulation versus Competition: How Regulation Explains Price Variation in Title Insurance among States."

Always one of our most interesting programs of the year, it is very stimulating to learn about the important research being done by women right here in Austin. All branch meetings are open to the public, so you are welcome to invite a neighbor, members of your family and friends. This also would be an excellent opportunity to ask a prospective branch member to attend with you!

23 of the 39 active AAUW branches in Texas sent representatives to the AAUW Texas 45th Biennial Convention at the Austin Sheraton Hotel at the Capitol April 13-15, 2012. The Credentials Committee reported a registration total of 91. That included branch members, past state presidents, AAUW Texas Board members, a College/ University Partner, students and guests.

During the convention participants heard keynote speakers, attended workshops and elected officers for the 2012-1214 biennium. The flag ceremony opening the General Session Saturday morning was led by the Walnut Creek Service Unit of the Girls Scouts of Central Texas. Former State President, Austin Branch member **Ann Berasley** is the Troop Leader. Austin Branch President, **Kay Watson**, and Diane Melton, Georgetown Branch President, welcomed the delegates and guests.

<u>Public Education in Texas was the main focus — "31st Isn't Good Enough for Her"</u> [In recently released rankings of how states' primary education systems are preparing students for careers in engineering, Texas Public Education ranks 31st, as reported in the November 14, 2011 and March 16, 2012 issues of *The Huffington Post*.]

Outstanding speakers included four panelists: <u>Mark Strama</u>, State Representative District 50; <u>David Hinojosa</u>, Southwest Regional Counsel for the Mexican American Legal Defense & Educational Fund; <u>Kathy Miller</u>, Texas Freedom Network; <u>Linda Bridges</u>, Texas Federation of Teachers. The discussion about public education in Texas was led by Moderator Georgia Kidwell, founding president of the Hurst (now Northeast Tarrant County) Branch and former Public Policy Chair on the Texas State Board.

AAUW Director-at-Large, <u>Sandy Camillo</u>, relayed updates from national AAUW during the Saturday luncheon. During a breakout session she presented the new AAUW research, *Crossing the Line*, a study of bullying in schools.

Other Breakout sessions included: *Title IX in Vocational Education*, Jayma Vaughan and three students from the Institute of Hospitality and Culinary Arts at Travis High School in Austin; *Mother/Daughter STEM*, Lane Powell and Joy Vann, Lubbock Branch; *Bylaws Changes*, Mary Ann Huslig, State Bylaws/Parliamentarian; *Membership Matters*, Stephany Compton, State Membership VP; *Membership Payment Program*, Margo Johnson, Fort Bend County Branch and State Webmaster; **Inés García**, incoming State Finance Officer, current Treasurer and former President, Austin Branch.
