
# Professor Peter Trubowitz to Speak at January 19 Branch Meeting



Peter Trubowitz, Professor of Government at the University of Texas at Austin, will discuss "Presidential Politics and US Foreign Policy" during a January 19th breakfast meeting at the Doubletree Hotel. Professor Trubowitz is the author of three books on international affairs and has published research in both professional and popular journals. His book *Politics and Strategy* was named a *Choice Magazine*. "Outstanding Academic Title" for 2011. Dr. Trubowitz has held the J. William Fulbright Distinguished Lectureship in American Foreign Policy (Beijing Foreign Studies University), and has served as a visiting scholar at Harvard's Center for International Affairs, Princeton's Center of International Studies, and the Centro de Investigacion y Docencia Economicas in Mexico City. He received his PhD from MIT.




