

She had a 34-year career with Nabisco, Kraft and Nestle working as an Operations Manager for 30 years and then with the Sales group as an analyst the last 4 years. She moved back to Austin in 2007 and traveled 42 weeks a year during her last 2 years with Nestle, retiring in 2012. Jan is single and her 92-year-old father moved in with her over a year ago so her life is busy taking care of him. She is also a Board Member (Secretary) for Central TX Children's Home in Buda. After retirement from the service, her father settled them in Roslyn, Long Island, where she graduated from Roslyn High School in 1965 and from the University of Vermont in 1969 with a B.S in (Elementary) Education and a minor in Art. She moved to Dayton, Ohio, where she was an elementary teacher for several years. The B&B, with rooms still under construction, was on the Georgetown Heritage Society's Holiday Homes tour in 2000. Two years later, their gardens were on the Heritage Society's Spring Garden tour.

For health reasons, they sold the B&B in 2005 and moved to Austin, where they quickly became involved in Austin Newcomers and (for her) various art societies. John passed away in 2014, and Susan began volunteering for the Assistance League Austin (ALA). She has served in leadership for professional and service organizations in college and all her adult life, as well as for numerous art organizations in Georgetown and Austin.
