MA in Sociology, U. of FL, and Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration, University of North Texas Dean of College of Liberal Arts, Texas State University, 1996-2012

Three trips to Cuba in Summer 1956, Spring 1959 (post-revolution) and Spring 2016, gave Dr. Ann Marie Ellis a unique perspective on Cuban history, revolution and US-Cuban relations. A summer in Oriente Provience when Fidel Castro and Che Guevara were in the nearby Sierra Maesta Mountains inspired Ellis' lifelong interest in sociology, social revolutions, and international issues. Ellis tells the story of Cuba, in part, through the life of "Tanya," her girlhood Cuban friend. Ann Marie has been an advocate for international study and study abroad experiences for students throughout her career at Texas State, and through her church she has worked on refugee resettlement.

Spanish American War Memorial) beginning at 11:30. Remember parking


will take some time.
