Kudos to **Sally Scott** who invited Brandi Clark Burton, an Austin social entrepreneur, trusted green advisor, and recognized community leader, to present our "green" April program! Brandi's special passion is food waste, and she had some very shocking facts for those in attendance at the LCRA Redbud Center. Twenty-five percent of the food that comes into American households every month is wasted; on average that amounts to about \$133.00 a month. Annually in the U.S., forty percent of food in the farm-to-family pipeline is wasted. Globally, half of the food produced does not get eaten!

Brandi challenged us with the question "Where is away?" as in when food is thrown "away," where does it go! Then she gave us an excellent overview of several models of composting recommended by the Food Recovery Hierarchy Council. Brandi has created Austin EcoNetwork and compiles and sends a twice-weekly EcoNews email. It is a great way to keep up with environmental news and events in the Austin community. 

#### **GIRLSTART & LATINITAS with Lilac Bauer**

The Girls in STEM Conference has come and gone with 576 girls attending the Conference on April 6 at the University of Texas Educational Conference Center. There were 95+ presenters (each was given an AAUW pencil) and 150+ volunteers from the colleges and volunteer organizations in Austin.

Twelve AAUW members and a visiting granddaughter contributed forty-eight hours of service preparing the reminder postcards to mail to the girls; preparing 'robot' activity kits for the girls to do as they arrived at the conference; and stuffing the goodie backpacks with schedule, instructions for the robot, Girlstart stickers, the pencils our Branch contributed, Girlstart lipgloss, and phone screen cleaners. Two of our members, Ruth Falck and Veronica Johnson, went through the online volunteer registration portal for Girlstart, and were each asked to sit in on one session of a hands-on activity as two of five helpers. This will be available for anyone who wishes to participate as an individual next year. Where Girlstart needs us as a group is in stuffing the goodie bags; the thirteen of us worked long and hard, and had to come back an extra day to finish that many totes/backpacks! A collective of Fortune 500 companies awarded Girlstart Afterschool Program and Girlstart Summer Camp the "Programs that work" recognition for significantly impacting Girls in STEM education. It will cost \$300 for one girl to attend one week of camp this summer. I will be setting up a donor page under my name as the AAUW Liaison for anyone who would like to contribute any amount they can to send a girl to Girlstart Summer Camp. Of course, you can also sponsor a girl yourself!

We are building a new connection with the Latinitas organization, which is based in South Austin. We learned of them last May when Lauren Gonzalez Donnelly, one of the cofounders, gave a wonderful presentation on the beginnings of this program and what they hope to accomplish. They are organized similarly to the Girlstart Afterschool program; the focal point for the group is to reach middle and high school girls through the publication of an online magazine, which develops skills in technology, marketing, literacy, and encourages confidence and an interest in going to college. They planned their first half-day Saturday conference last September and are hoping to enlarge on it this year, again in September. They need mentors, female role models, volunteer assistance with clerical and publicity tasks, presenters, etc. So far, Mary Ellen Scribner and Lilac Bauer have completed the online volunteer app, and taken the on-site orientation; Sylvia Garcia and **Inés Garcia** have completed the online app and are scheduled to take the orientation the third Thursday in May at 6 p.m. Anyone else who is interested, please contact me so that we can also place you in the May orientation.
