## VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR REGIONAL SCIENCE FAIR

In discussions of new projects for the Branch to undertake, one idea put forward was the creation of a Branch clearinghouse group of members interested in serving as judges or evaluators in competitions held by local schools and youth organizations or by community organizations that award scholarships or other forms of recognition to young people in our community. Now, we have a serendipitous opportunity for a trial run. A request for just such volunteers has been put forward by Austin Energy.

The Austin Energy Regional Science Festival is one of Texas's largest region science fair competitions with more than 3,5000 participating students from local and area schools. Austin Energy needs six hundred judges and volunteers for the 2014 fair which will be held February 19-22 at the Palmer Events Center. Students who win top awards in their school science fair progress to compete at the regional science event for the opportunity to advance to state and international science fair competitions. More than five hundred judges and one hundred volunteers are needed to ensure its success. If you volunteer or someone you know volunteers at a local school, you could inquire if help is needed for the school's science fair, speech tournament, UIL events, etc. If you or someone you know is a member of an organization that presents an award or scholarship to area high schools students, you could offer assistance in that selection. If enough members are interested in this kind of volunteering, we can organize it as a Branch project.



## HOST FULBRIGHT STUDENTS FORA MEAL

During 2014, the Institute of International Education (IIE) is organizing enrichment seminars for first-year Fulbright students in ten cities throughout the U.S. The Fulbright Program--of which these seminars are an important part--is funded by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State. The Austin Enrichment Seminar will take place January 30-February 2, 2014. Approximately 140 students, representing more than sixty countries, will participate in the seminar. They will be hosted here by GlobalAustin (www.globalaustin.org).

An important goal of the seminar is to introduce the Fulbrighters to the city of Austin and to promote their interaction with local residents. To that end, we are organizing an evening of home hospitality or a hosted restaurant dinner with citizens of Austin. This event has been enormously successful in the past and it is often the only opportunity for foreign Fulbrighters to spend an evening in an American home. We would like to invite you to host a small group of Fulbright students for dinner in your home or at a restaurant on Friday evening, January 31.

If you would like to host a group of students, there is a host application form which you can complete online <<u>https://adobeformscentral.com/?</u> f=NX4Ds47CYbcNxoewXb\*oyw>. Please complete the form by December 20. It would be very helpful if you could host between two and five students. If you would like to request students from a specific country or those studying a particular discipline, please indicate your preference on the form. Every effort will be made to match you with appropriate students. The seminar will be held at the Sheraton Austin Hotel at the Capitol, 701 E 11th Street.
