1 in 5 Texas Children Lives in Poverty, and State and Local Policies Don't Do Enough to Support the Success of Every Texas Kid

New State of Texas Children report from the Center for Public Policy Priorities provides data and policy solutions to state leaders ahead of the 2019 legislative session

Large disparities in child poverty across race, ethnicity and gender persist in Texas due to historical and current discriminatory policies, according to the **State of Texas Children** report released by the Center for Public Policy Priorities recently. As state lawmakers prepare to gather in January for the 2019 legislative session, they should keep Texas' one in five children living in poverty at the top of their minds when they are making decisions during the upcoming legislative session. The report lays out the challenges Texas children and families face and also some common-sense policy solutions for state leaders to consider.

MORE Women IN ACTION

Your AAUW Board has been facing somewhat of dilemma over the last couple of months. Last year the Board made a decision to lower the cost of all luncheons to hopefully increase attendance, even if it meant that we would have to pay the difference in cost. That decision has been very successful! We feel we speak for the rest of the Board in being delighted that our programs have been so well attended. All reports are that participants were delighted with the content.

This great success in participation and excitement to attend has come with a cost – no shows. Reservations are required on a date determined by the venue. We have tried to make it clear in the past that if you made a reservation, you made a commitment and thus would be expected to pay the cost of the meal --- just like AAUW has to do. We make the reservation on the determined date and are responsible for that amount.

Your Board has been discussing this and I must say that I have been the consistent Bad Guy. We feel it is very clear cut. If one makes a commitment – to anything – you are responsible. BUT there are exceptions to everything. The exception on reservations is – IF YOU are unexpectedly required to be in the hospital or other care institution, you are exempt and not responsible for payment.

Additionally, IF AAUW changes the date of an event after you have made reservations and you cannot attend, you are exempt and not responsible for payment. There is always the option to cancel your reservation by the date we have to commit to the venue.
