No show policy - The good news is that our branch meetings are well-attended and that the programs continue to be extraordinary. The downside is that we rely on a reservation system to provide meals, coffee service and seating. Unfortunately, once the reservation deadline is past and we have given the venue our reservation count, we are charged based on those numbers and we cannot rely on walk-ins to make up the difference. Our policy is that people who make reservations and do not show up are expected to pay the cost of the meal. The exception to this is IF YOU are unexpectedly required to be in the hospital or other care institution, you are exempt and not responsible for payment. Additionally, IF AAUW changes the date of an event after you have made reservations and you cannot attend, you are exempt and not responsible for payment. There is always the option to cancel your reservation by the date we have to commit to the venue. We appreciate your understanding the need for this policy.

# REMEMBERING

Nancy V. Myers
March 11, 1928 - March 15, 2020

The AAUW Austin Branch lost one of its most treasured members on Sunday, March 15, 2020, with the death of Nancy V. Myers. Born March 11, 1928, in Indiana, Nancy had just celebrated her 92<sup>nd</sup> birthday at the time of her passing. A true daughter of Indiana, she earned a B.S. in mathematics from Purdue University in 1949. She would ultimately serve on the Valparaiso Community Schools Board from 1964 to 1972 and as a trustee of Purdue University from 1972 to '75. She also served for a time as chairman of the Indiana CPA Board.

Nancy joined AAUW immediately upon graduation in 1949 and thus achieved the status of honorary life membership in 1999. She served AAUW Texas and AAUW Austin in several executive capacities including branch president for 2002-03; branch treasurer, 1994-98; on the branch program committee 2010-2012; and as AAUW-TX treasurer 1998-2002. Kind, gracious and generous, Nancy supported the mission of AAUW with her time, expertise, and financial resources. For many years, she annually used her accounting experience to review the branch's financial records. The Branch honored her with named gifts to AAUW Funds in 1995, 2000, and 2002.

She was involved from its beginning in EYH (Expanding Your Horizons) and the annual STEM-focused conference for girls that the Branch began cosponsoring in 1990. In the early 2010s Girlstart assumed oversight of the EYH programs, and Nancy continued her service to the cause through volunteering with Girlstart; she always attended the annual Gamechangers Luncheon fundraiser. Along with her dear friend **Mary Ellen Sims**, Nancy was an integral part of the branch's support of Mainspring Schools. The duo worked closely with Rudi Andrus, longtime executive director of the schools, to maintain and strengthen the Branch's relationship with the institution it had partnered with the City of Austin to establish in 1941.

Nancy was also a steadfast volunteer in fundraising efforts such as hosting AAUW Night at Ten Thousand Villages (where she was a shift volunteer) during the holiday shopping season, gift-wrapping for tips at Barnes and Noble, silent auctions at branch meetings, and more.

Nancy enjoyed the social side of AAUW activities in the interest groups for Art Tours and for Culture and Cuisine, reflecting her personal interests in travel, sports, art, music, architecture and archaeology. She was a regular attendee of branch monthly programs as long as her health permitted and usually arrived with a car-full of her Northwest Austin neighbors that variously included Roberta Nance, lileen Payton, and Raemar Shown.

Married for well over fifty years to Gene, described in the recent tribute to our branch nonagenarians as "one of our favorite AAUW husbands", Nancy is also survived by a daughter, son, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. Nancy will be greatly missed by her family, friends, and by AAUW Austin. We were fortunate to have had her as a member, as our friend and valued AAUW mentor for many years. Friends also remember that Nancy enjoyed life and had a love of cardinals.
