## **Public Policy**

- *The Public Policy Committee* was very active during this legislative year. Their activities included the following:

# • 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

- o The Centennial Committee began meeting in fall 2022 to plan our celebration.
- o The celebration will be November 1 at Chateau Bellevue.
- A proclamation from the Texas House of Representatives was presented.
- o A press release announcing the celebration was sent to the media.

## • Interest Groups

 The Southwest and Central Book Groups funded projects to buy books for the libraries at Williams and Allison, both schools serving low resource communities. The creative stitchery group worked on cloth books projects to donate.

# • Fellowships

- o Three fellowships of \$3650 were awarded to UT doctoral candidates.
- Two scholarships were awarded to women over 25 attending Austin Community College.

# • Mainspring Schools

 Management of the Mainspring \$10,000 endowment moved to the Austin Community Foundation.

# • College and University Partners

 This was a challenging year to connect with our previous partners. This will be focus for the coming year.

## **Membership Recruitment and Engagement**

Goal: Gather baseline data on how much our members are engaged the 2022-2023 program year.

# Membership

 Our first in-person summer social for awhile was held in August 2022. This year we lost 5 members and gained 20 for a total of 161 members

### Programs

 An average of 41 members attended programs at the Balcones Country Club and 34 members joined us for programs at the Unity Church.

#### Interest Groups

 Interest groups had a combined total of 265 members participating in the thirteen interest groups. Members participated in multiple groups, with some engaged in 3 or 4 groups.

### • Communication

- Our rate of opening the newsletter and click rate are above industry standards and have improved since last year: 73% of members have opened at least one newsletter. 43% have clicked on at least one article.
- The website is updated upon request by members and lists upcoming events.

# • Funds

- Our active funds team and generous donors resulted in \$3,839 sent to the national Greatest Needs Fund.
- Change for Change coin collection brought in \$628 to support branch operations.
- Many members donate monthly to AAUW national
